Shri Vile Parle Kelavani Mandal's Institute of Pharmacy, Dhule (SVKM IOP) is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University (DBATU), Lonere, Maharashtra.

The curriculum of the B. Pharmacy program is prescribed and provided by the DBATU. It is a four-year degree program divided into eight semesters.

The Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), New Delhi revised the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) pattern of curriculum for the B. Pharm Program and accepted by DBATU. It has been implemented by the SVKM IOP from the academic year 2017-18.

Institute has collected the feedback on PCI curriculum (2016-2017 pattern) from one of the important stakeholder i.e. teachers and suggestions given by them were analyzed and considered with special attention.

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
